How to reserve the Event Center:

- 1. Login into the Springs website, http://springscharterschools.org/user-login/
- 2. On the blue bar at the top, select "Events"
- 3. On the left of the page, select "Events" again.
- 4. Select "Schedule an Event"
- 5. Click on "Request to book an event at the Event Center"

6. That will bring you to the "Event Center Check List". Please read this carefully as it has instructions on parking, set up, and what is available to you at the Event Center. Once you have read the check list, click on the blue "Accept and Continue" button to the right of the page.

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- 7. Fill out your contact and event info and click "Continue"
- 8. If needed, design how you need the Event Center to be set up (this is optional) and click on "Create Event"

9. You will receive an email confirming that your request is submitted. This does not mean that it has been approved. The event center administrator will check the calendar availability and either accept or deny the event. You should receive another email informing you if your event has been approved.

10. One week before the event, submit a work order to IT or Facilities if you will need their support








The small size of the Oceanside Learning Center doesn't keep us from making learning fun and meaningful!



Teachers and students have been busy this past month:




