Imagine being wafted back across time for a chat with Benjamin Franklin, scientist, inventor, printer and statesman. *The Inventive Benjamin Franklin School Assembly* brings colonial America to life for your students in your school auditorium. Franklin will introduce you to his many inventions and discoveries, from swim fins to bi-focals, from the first lending library to the Constitution. Students are introduced to the world of electricity and science as Dr. Franklin demonstrates his static electrical generator, originally used to create a battery. Throughout the one-hour presentation, Franklin aims to ignite young minds with the wonders of science and invention!

The Constitution Convention
