Program information

Students in grades 3rd—6th act as early settlers as they travel through the park to explore the four regions of California Native Americans, the Gold Rush and California Missions. During this 2.5-hour program students will learn about the state's rich history including the influential events and people that shaped the Golden State including Chuck Yeager, Amelia Earhart, Howard Hughes, John Muir and Walt Disney. They will also be inspired as they learn of the obstacles early Californians overcame to fulfill their dreams.

During this interactive field study, students will:

- Discuss three famous aviators who impacted California's history.
- Identify the four regions of California on a map.
- Compare and contrast immigration and migration.
- Articulate the who, what, where, when and why of the Gold Rush.
- Learn about the California missions.

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- Discover the culture of two Native-American tribes of California.
- Share with the group their own "California dreams."
