After everyone has arrived and is on the main green, the regulars will check you for contraband. If smugglers are found, they will be arrested in a brief recreation of the "Gaspee Affair." The excitement begins when the American minutemen attempt to come to the rescue.

After the opening skirmish, you'll be off to participate in several hands-on stations. Text books come alive as students participate in these fun and challenging activities.
