- ◆ All students must be accompanied by a registered adult.

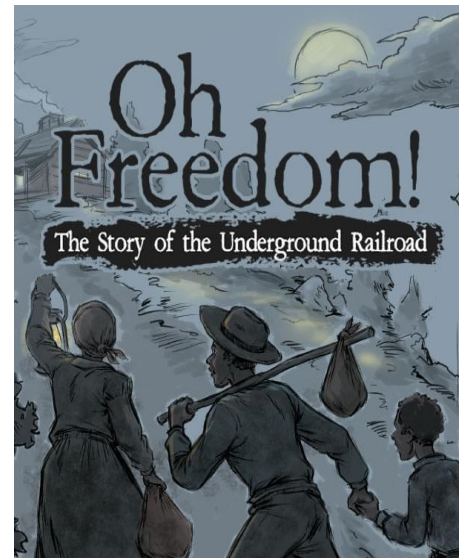
